1831. The tower over the front porch was added in 1834.

PROTESTANT CAY: Out across the harbor and popularly known as "The Cay," it is the home of the Hotel on the Cay, as well as the blue-green St. Croix ground lizard, exterminated by the mongoose and now found only here and on Green Cay. Its name derives from the the late 1600s when non-Catholics, refused burial on the main island, were interred here. A ferry runs every ten min (\$3 RT if you are not a guest of the hotel).

If you are fortunate enough to arrive here when it is open, the **St. Croix Archeological Museum** (\$\pi\$ 692-2365, 773-9595), 6 Company Street in **Apothecary Hall**, is well worth a visit. Artifacts here found on St. Croix date back as far as 2000 BCF. A wide

worth a visit. Artifacts here found on St. Croix date back as far as 2000 BCE. A wide selection of tools (shell and stone tools, flaked tools, and various shell implements) are among the items on display. The free museum is open on Sat., 10 AM– 2 PM.

Also here is the recreated **Apothecary Shop** in **Apothecary Hall** which has finishing touches right down to the rocking chair and the fine collection of original bottles and vials on the shelves.

OTHERS: Constructed from limestone blocks, the St. John's Anglican Church on King St. dates from 1849–1858; it was first established in 1772. It's done in the Gothic Revival style prescribed for Anglican Churches worldwide. A few years younger (1852) and a bit farther down the road stands the Friedensthal Moravian Church. Founded by Moravians in the 1750s in order to evangelize and train enslaved Africans, it dates from 1852–1854.

Just **outside the town** are a number of ruins including the Estate Richmond (near

Bassin Triangle), the old Danish Prison, Estate Orange Grove, and Estate Hermon Hill (at Questa Verde and Hermon Hill Road). Jacobsberg Ridge (within walking distance nearby) commands an excellent view.
